Fine Arts Show Opens Sept. 24

One of Eugene's many cultural resources is a large number of fine artists who regularly show their work nationally and internationally. Their local exhibits are rare.

On Friday, Sept. 24 at noon, the **Mayor's Invitational Fine Arts Show** in the Park Willamette Building opens. The show is one of the activities of **The Eugene Celebration**, which officially begins at 4 pm on Friday, Sept. 30 and concludes at midnight on Sunday, Oct. 2.

Some 42 well-known local artists are displaying work, ranging

from oil paintings to bronze sculpture. Most of the items are on sale for prices from \$300 to \$17,000.

Hope Pressman and Maurie Jacobs are the honorary co-chairs for the show, which was underwritten by a grant from The Eugene Downtown Association.

Hours for the Fine Arts Show are: Sept. 25, noon-5 pm; Sept. 26-29, noon-6 pm; Sept. 30, noon-8 pm; Oct. 1, noon-8 pm; and Oct. 2, noon-5 pm.

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
