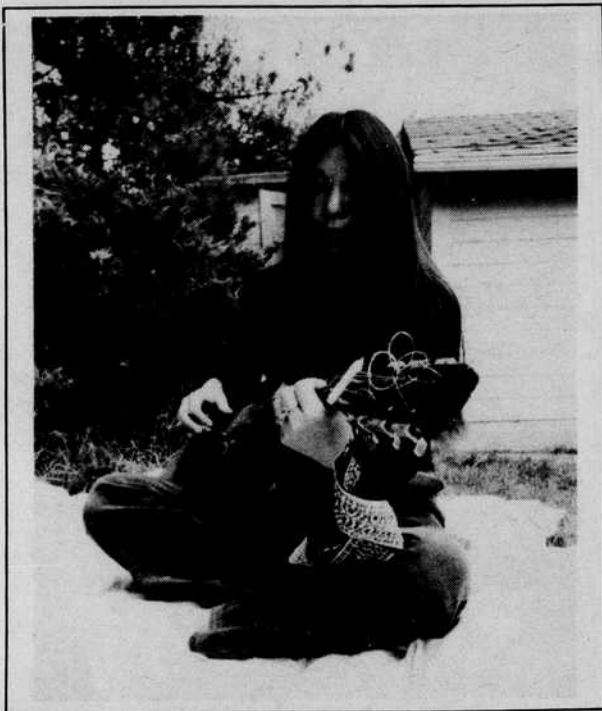


MUSIC

A.J.'s Barbeque is a newly remodeled, great alternative, soft, enjoyable spot. 756 W. Park St. 343-9587.

Community Center for the Performing Arts, known as the WOW Hall (because of its former ownership by the Woodsmen of the World), has a beautiful wood dance floor and all ages are welcome because drinking is downstairs. Eighth & Lincoln Sts. 687-2746.

Dexter Lake Club is on the shores of Dexter Lake, fifteen miles from Eugene on Highway 58.

Emerald Valley Forrest Inn Lounge has a small dance floor and the music is usually top 40's and originals. 83293 Dale Kuni Rd., Creswell. 485-6796.

The Factory is actually a converted factory with lots of space, a huge wood dance floor, a very large, antique wooden bar, other antique furniture. Rustic and casual atmosphere. 4740 Main St., Springfield. 747-7900.

High St. Coffee Gallery is just that—a coffee bar (pick up your own) and gallery with different shows monthly. Music at night is usually folk, sometimes classical. 1243 High St. 345-7361.

Scampi's lounge is upstairs and intimate and dancing takes place. Music is usually jazz, vocal and instrumental. Seventh & Lawrence Sts. 485-0601.

Studio One Cabaret is in the basement of the Hult Center. Lots of room to dance. Tables also for listening. Hult Center, Eugene Center. 687-5000.

Treehouse Lounge has continuously provided good jazz. It's near the U of O and popular with the University crowd. 1769 Franklin Blvd. 485-3444.

Wan Shine Inn is across from the Hilton and the Hult and now has acoustic music every Thurs., Fri. and Sat. 44 E. Seventh. 342-5098.

ZooZoo's/Cafe Z serves natural foods and you can listen to music while you eat. Mostly acoustic folk, sometimes blues or Celtic. 454 Willamette St. 344-4764.

Dance To Benefit Wilderness

The University of Oregon Survival Center is hosting a benefit dance on October 8, at 8 p.m., in the Erb Memorial Ballroom.

All proceeds from the event will be given to the Oregon Natural Resources Council to further its lobbying efforts in support of HR 1149, the Oregon Forest Wilderness Bill.

The dance will feature the local bands Arousing Spirit and The Porcupines. Tickets are available at the Survival Center, the EMU Main Desk, and other outlets in the Eugene community. Cost of the event is \$2.50 in advance, and \$3 the night of the show.

HR 1149 proposes to increase the area of Oregon's protected forested wilderness by 1.2 million acres. Of the 31 million

acres of forested land in Oregon, approximately one million are currently protected, while more than 25 million are roaded and used for logging and other developed purposes.

If the bill is passed, more than 80 percent of the state's forested acreage will be available for timber production, while some of the state's most outstanding and unique wildlife habitats and recreation areas will become protected.

The bill is supported by a diverse assortment of conservationists, sports-persons, commercial fish catchers, Indian tribes and scientists.
