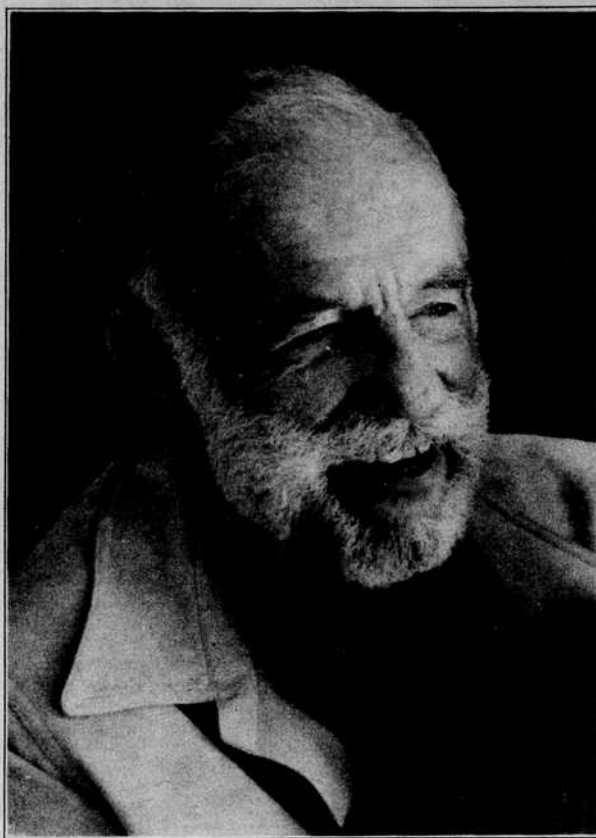


## Hard Times Lunches

Dr. Benjamin Spock will speak on the topic of *Raising Children in the Nuclear Age*. Dr. Spock, author of *Baby and Child Care* and *Raising Children in a Difficult Time*, is co-chairman of the National Committee for a Sane Nuclear Policy and is also a spokesman for the peace movement. Combining his interests in child health and psychology, the Vietnam War and personal and political behavior with

concern for nuclear policy, *Raising Children in the Nuclear Age* should prove a provocative and informative lecture topic. Oct. 15th at 8 pm in the EMU Ballroom. Tickets are \$1 for students, \$2 for the public and are available at the door.



## WISTEC

Willamette Science and Technology Center, Oregon's only science and technology museum outside the Portland area, is launching its annual fund drive. Located in Eugene next to Autzen Stadium, WISTEC has gained broad visibility and attracted diverse audiences with a variety of popular programs ranging from computer programming classes to Astronomy Day, a radio show on technology, and Saturday science workshops for kids during home football games.

WISTEC's goal for the 6-week drive is \$25,000. Corporate and individual gifts make up about 22% of WISTEC's \$110,000 operating budget. The non-profit science center earns nearly two-thirds of its own revenue from admissions, memberships, class fees and special events. Foundation grants make up the rest of WISTEC's income.
