As the holidays approach, so does the time for burglaries at Northwest Working Press. Twice over the Thanksgiving vacation, a man was interrupted while apparently drilling at the door of the shop.

Eugene's collective print shop has been broken into every winter for three years. The first two times, bookkeeping records were the only things stolen. Last winter, however, the intruders sprayed red paint all over the shop and stole \$2100 worth of camera lenses. The community responded generously to Northwest Working Press's plea for donations. Enough money was raised to replace the lenses and install a burglar alarm and other security equipment.

Since the Thanksgiving incidents, the Press has taken added security precautions. It is hard not to wallow in paranoid speculations about the possible political nature of these burglaries. However, Northwest Working Press is alive and well! Neither the quantity of our political printing nor the quality of our commercial printing will be lessened by this harassment.
