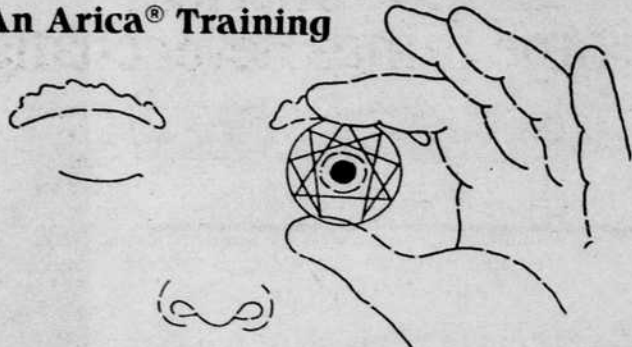

Computer Guide for Parents

To introduce parents to the opportunities computers offer in their kids' classrooms, University of Oregon Prof. David Moursund has written and published the "Parents' Guide to Computers in Education." The guide is available for \$3.50 from the International Council for Computers in Education, 1787 Agate St., Eugene 97403.

Moursund's book introduces parents to the opportunities computers offer in the classroom and acquaints them with potentially confusing jargon. The book describes the various ways computers can be used in the schools as well as step-by-step instructions for parents to guide their children through the information age.

The "Parents' Guide" also features a four-step buyer's plan for those interested in purchasing a home computer. It concludes with a glossary so that parents are able to tell a "bit" from a "bug."

Moursund, a computer science/curriculum and instruction professor and president of the ICCE, suggests one way parents can become more familiar with what may seem to be alien machines is to spend time playing with them.

"Visit an electronic arcade and plan to spend a few dollars," he advises.

"Begin by watching children play the various games and then try several different ones. Remember, this is a serious educational experience. Take care you don't have too much fun!"

Another way to gain hands-on experience is to visit a computer store for a little instruction and demonstration. Moursund suggests. Schools, a friend or neighbor and workplaces with computers are other sources for building machine familiarity, he says. Advertisements, news articles and television provide additional information on computer-related topics.

Moursund urges parents to ask their children what they know about computers. If computers are not available in the child's school as learning aids, he urges parents to ask administrators why.
