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Northwest Country Inns

Free Map Available

A new map showing locations of 18 country inns in the Pacific Northwest is now available free by writing Unique Northwest Country Inns, 4000 Westcliff Drive, Hood River, OR 97031.

This collection of the Northwest's most special and historic lodgings are located from Puget Sound, Washington, to Ashland, Oregon and from the Pacific Ocean to eastern Oregon. They range in size from a two-bedroom bed-and-breakfast cottage to a 46-room vintage hotel.

Each of the inns is located near a scenic, cultural or historic attraction. Eight are listed on the National Register of Historic Places, and all are famous for their exceptional cuisine, gracious hosts, attention to detail, and comfortable accommodations.

Following is a brief description of some of the closer to Eugene sites, but there are many more and equally interesting lodges to choose from, including Eugene's own Campus Cottage, a bed-and-breakfast inn on E. 19th Ave. For a complete reference, send for the map.

Channel House—Gray-shingled oceanfront lodgings overlooking the narrow entrance to Depoe Bay, Oregon. Seven rooms (includes two suites with fireplaces and kitchen), ranging from \$30 to

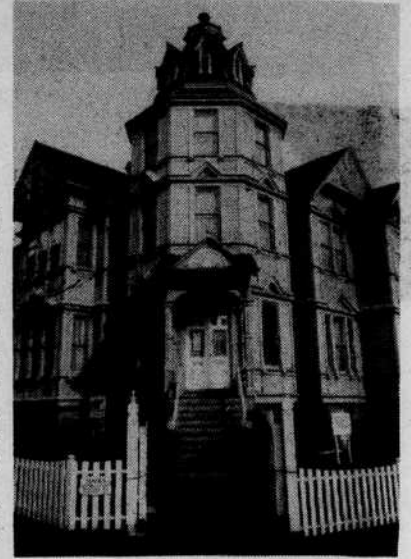
\$95, double occupancy. Continental breakfast included. Dining room specializes in fresh, local seafood. (503) 765-2140.

The Jacksonville Inn—1863 National Historic Landmark in vintage gold-rush town of Jacksonville, Oregon. Eight antique-decorated rooms, air conditioned, private baths, \$38 to \$55, continental breakfast included. (503) 899-1900.

Johnson House—1892 white clapboard home in the restored old-town district of Florence, Oregon. Four antique-decorated rooms, shared baths, \$34 double. Full country breakfast included; afternoon tea available. (503) 997-8000.

Romeo Inn—Fifty-year-old residence restored to original Cape Cod design in Ashland, Oregon. Four rooms with king-sized beds, private baths are \$63 double, including breakfast. Swimming pool, jacuzzi, reading room with fireplace. (503) 488-0884.

Chanticleer Inn—1920 bungalow-style home with European country decor in Ashland. Six antique-filled rooms, with view or patio and private bath, are \$59 double in summer, \$48 double in winter. Air-conditioned, open-hearth fireplace, fresh flowers, comforters. Full country breakfast

in sunny dining room, or breakfast in bed by request. (503) 482-1919.

Madison Inn—1903 Queen Anne-style structure is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. Five rooms (one with private bath) have leaded windows, hand-sewn comforters, \$25 to \$30 double. Breakfast included. In Corvallis. (503) 757-1274.

Steamboat Inn—Pine-paneled cabins overlooking the North Umpqua River of Oregon. Eight cabins with queen-sized beds and private bath are \$48 double. Famous fisherman's dinners plus home cooked food and homemade pies. (503) 496-3495 or 498-2411.

Columbia Gorge Hotel—Fine small hotel built in 1921 offers 46 guest rooms \$78 to \$98, double occupancy; includes World Famous Farm Breakfast of seasonal fruits, eggs, bacon, ham, hot cakes, biscuits and more. Exceptional grounds and views. (503) 386-5566.

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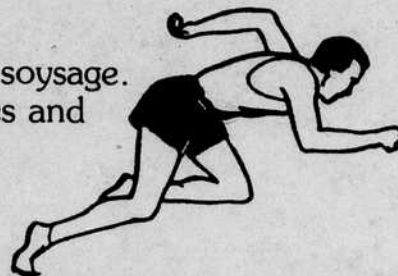
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
