**Voluntary Action**

The Voluntary Action Center recruits and refers volunteers to fill needs in the community. The following are some of the positions open in the community right now:

**Yard Maintenance Volunteers** to help senior citizens with their yard work.

**Drivers** to transport kids, adults, seniors and blind individuals around the Eugene area. Some agencies can reimburse for mileage.

**Teacher Aides** for preschool, sewing, photography and cooking at non-profit agencies and in the Eugene 4-J School District.

**Computer Volunteers** are needed to help an information and referral agency update its files. Volunteers can also help as placement counselors.

**Skill Trainers** to work directly with mentally handicapped clients to teach them living skills, community integration, language, and recreational skills. Training will be given.

**El Salvador: Eyewitness Report**

Humanitarian America is making its own foreign policy. In contrast to the bombing and destruction financed by the U.S. Government in El Salvador, the money contributed to New El Salvador Today (NEST) is used for "development of the basic resources necessary for life: agriculture production, child and adult education, and community health care."

Based in Berkeley, California, NEST, a tax-deductible foundation, has sent over \$80,000 to various projects in El Salvador. The funds are sent directly to the people who use it through community based projects run by those determining their own course for development.

Diane Green is the West Coast Regional Director of NEST. She returned in March from a fact-finding tour of El Salvador's zones of popular control. She will talk about her experience on Thursday, June 13 at 7:30 pm in the EMU Forum Room, UO Campus. Her talk is entitled *Under the Bombs in El Salvador*. She personally experienced a bombing attack while there.
