New Art Business

The public is invited to join Maude Kerns Art Center members and friends of Mike and Mary Catlin for a reception at the Art Center (1910 E 15th Ave, Eugene) Friday, June 21 between 7 and 9 pm.

The reception marks the opening of the Catlins' fine art poster business, Mary Catlin Productions, a new Eugene venture designed to market Eugene art throughout the country.

The new business is a joint venture of the Catlins, in which Mike supplies the artistic talent and Mary will oversee the production and business operation. Although the couple hope to produce many posters with a wide variety of subjects in the future, featuring the work of other artists, they have chosen a nos-

talistic portrait of a neighborhood grocery store (specifically "Bob's Superette") as the subject for the first poster.

Mike Catlin, a commercial photographer and former Maude Kerns photographer and photography instructor, shot Bob's Superette, until recently located at the corner of 13th and Patterson in Eugene, for the subject of the first poster because of its universal appeal. When he shot "Bob's" he had no idea that this ever-popular Eugene landmark and its colorful owner would soon be gone.

The poster, which Mary Catlin has already started marketing nationwide, retails for \$20 and is available at most art stores and galleries, including the Maude Kerns Art Center gift shop.

Shakespeare Festivities

The Oregon Shakespearean Festival in Ashland, Oregon, is commemorating its 50th anniversary this year, with special celebrations on July 2-4, the actual birthdates of the Festival.

The Festival began in 1935 as part of Ashland's Fourth of July celebration. Festival founder Angus L. Bowmer and a handful of friends and volunteers staged the First Annual Shakespearean Festival with two plays in three days on a makeshift Elizabethan stage on the same site where the outdoor plays are staged today.

This year's festivities include the annual Renaissance Feast, to be held July 2 (sold out) and July 3, a Fourth of July parade and fair in Lithia Park, and special birthday celebrations following evening performances. There will also be free concerts, talks and lectures.
