## Stuttgart Orchestra Gives Free Performance

The University of Stuttgart Symphony Orchestra, directed by Manfred Muller-Cant, will give a free concert at 8 pm Friday, July 19, in Beall Concert Hall at the University of Oregon School of Music.

The orchestra will perform Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart's "Overture, K. 318"; Johann Sebastian Bach's "Suite No. 2 in B Minor, BWV 1067"; Muller-Cant's "Overture '59'"; and Ludwig van Beethoven's "Symphony No. 8 in F Major, Op. 93."

The ensemble is composed of students and staff from all departments of the University of Stuttgart, as well as students from the College of Music. Its repertoire includes both classical and modern works.

In addition to its concert tours, the orchestra has presented a number of first performances and television broadcasts. Foreign appearances have included three trips to Turkey and concerts in Brussels, Ghent, Lyon, Paris, Verdun and St. Moritz.

Muller-Cant also serves as director of sacred music and general music director at the University of Stuttgart. He conducts the University Choir and the Paul-Gerhardt Chamber Orchestra. In 1968, he was named "Chevalier des Palmes Academiques."

## Curtis Salgado Here This Weekend

The boundless energy and infectious stage exuberance of Curtis Salgado first surfaced to tavern and nightclub audiences of Oregon in 1974, when he became the man at the controls of Eugene's Nighthawk band. In 1977 he joined the Robert Cray Band contributing to their broadening success and critical notice.

You already know how Curtis was victimized by John Belushi and Dan Akroyd, for enormous personal gain, in their Blues Brothers persona. The cartoon interpretation of this earnest rhythm and blues performer left deep scars in a worldwide community of artists and devotees.

Now Curtis may have found an appropriate vehicle for his exuberant talents. Since late 1984 he has been singing with the superb East Coast horn band, Roomful of Blues. Rave notices have followed major performances by Curtis and Roomful from Houston to New York City. Last month Curtis was wading in roses thrown by a delicious audience in Stockholm, Sweden.

On July 19th and 20th Curtis will return to Eugene for a unique appearance at Old Taylor's Tavern; not with Roomful of Blues, but with musician friends from Eugene. The reunion promises down home, good time dance music calculated to bring out a smiling, shaking, finger-popping good time.
