Bluegrass Festival This Sunday

Eugene Parks and Recreation, in cooperation with KUGN FM, presents the 5th annual Country Days Bluegrass Festival in the Cuthbert Amphitheatre at Alton Baker Park on Sunday, July 28.

The festival begins at 11 am in the festival meadow with free activities planned throughout the day. Activities include free rides for kids, live country music featuring some of Eugene's finest country musicians, food booths, merchant displays, and a petting zoo from Wildlife Safari.

At 3:30 pm, musical entertainment on the Cuthbert Amphitheatre stage begins, sponsored by Henry Weinhard Private Reserve. Entertainment continues until dusk.

Berline, Crary and Hickman kick off the afternoon show with blistering bluegrass music: Byron Berline on the fiddle, Dan Crary on the guitar, and John Hickman on the banjo.

This group never fails to astound audiences with their intensity and timing of the music. Each member is sure where every note belongs. Berline, Crary and Hickman represent bluegrass at its best—glossy, sophisticated and played with finesse.

The second set of the day features outstanding Colorado talent. Hot Rize: Tim O'Brien, Pete Wernick, Charles Sawtelle and Nick Forster.



Red Knuckles and the Trailblazers are known as Hot Rize when not doing their comedy set. Their tongue-in-cheek renditions of Hank Williams, Lefty Frizzel and others are guaranteed to bring out the laughs. They'll be at the Bluegrass Festival, June 28, at Cuthbert Amphitheatre.

The *Houston Post* writes: "From their first set on, the crowds continued to build, the ovations grew, individual solos were greeted with cheers and whistles, and last but not least, the laughter rolled down during the group's comedy routines. They made believers out of us."

Hot Rize plays bluegrass with a fervent regard for its origins and adds a lively contemporary flair. In addition, Hot Rize plays a tongue-in-cheek set as Red Knuckles and the Trailblazers.

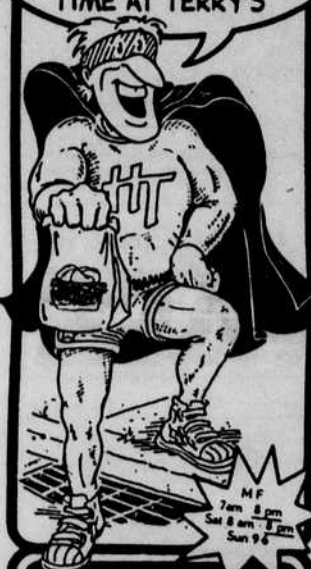
The Trailblazers play electrified western swing and honky tonk with punch and authority by adding a phase-shifted banjo or an electric bass. Red leads the Trailblazers through favorite hits by Hank Williams, Lefty Frizzel and Bob Wills.

Closing out the show will be

three-time Grammy Award winner Arthel "Doc" Watson. Watson, who is blind, was discovered in 1960 playing an electric guitar in a local country swing band in North Carolina and has since then rekindled his love of old-time music and acoustic instrumentation. Truly an amazing performer, Watson puts on a show from the heart. His songs are interspersed with a steady stream of chatter and stories about his life in North Carolina and Appalachia.
