Walk, Run or Paddle to Protect Oregon's Wilderness

The Oregon Natural Resources Council is sponsoring its 3rd Annual Walk Around Waldo over Labor Day Weekend, Aug. 31-Sept. 2. Weekend activities will begin Saturday with a day hike led by prominent Oregon botanists in the high Waldo Country. A hearty Saturday evening banquet and campfire festivities will follow. Camping reservations can be made for Saturday and/or Sunday nights in the Shadow Bay group campground.

The heart of the weekend is the Sunday Walk-Run-Paddle Around Waldo Lake. Participants collect pledges from friends, family and neighbors for each mile walked, run or paddled. Proceeds benefit ONRC's conservation program. The event is routed 15 miles around scenic Waldo Lake. Aid stations will be placed every five

miles. Watermelon and ice cold drinks will greet participants at the pick-up point at North Waldo. Those opting to complete the entire 21.5 mile loop may do so.

Families are encouraged to come. A supervised Tike Hike for children (5+ years) with professional outdoor educators will be led on Sunday with afternoon activities following. Parents may join their children or meet them after participating in the Waldo-Run-Paddle event.
