

Lane Co. vs. The Air Force Residents to comment on GWEN

Citizens of Lane County will have the first of two chances to express themselves publicly this Monday (Oct. 14) on the question of the proposed Air Force GWEN (GroundWave Emergency Network) transmitter in Eugene.

The two programs, scheduled by the recently created No-GWEN Alliance, encourage public comment both in favor of and against the project.

Leslie Brockelbank, spokesperson for no-GWEN, said, "Our feelings on the issue are pretty clear, and we think most citizens agree with our opposition to the project. But our main concern is to give the public an opportunity to express itself—something that has been denied us by the Air Force, which made no announcement about the project."

The meeting will begin at 7:30 pm in Harris Hall in downtown Eugene. A second town meeting on the same issue is scheduled for Nov. 11, also in Harris Hall.

Before discussion begins, brief opening comments on the issue will be made by State Representative Margie Hendriksen and by Steve Johnson of Decision Research, a local firm.

Brockelbank said Johnson has a special role to play: "If Steve had not come across reference to the project in a publication of limited distribution, we and the country itself might still be unaware of it."

"We have dual concerns. One is that the federal government has not honored existing land use procedures of Lane County. The other is that the project is being given the misleading description as a deterrent for nuclear war, when the facts show that such a function is impossible."

The Air Force has been invited to send representatives to both public meetings.

Oregon Sen. Mark O. Hatfield stated in an Aug. 21 letter to the No-GWEN Alliance, "Please be assured that I will support local efforts to stop construction of the proposed GWEN tower in Eugene."

The Eugene site is one of 240 scheduled to be built around the country.

Research by Barbara Keller, site survey chair for the Alliance, indicates five other Lane County sites have been considered by the Air Force in case the proposed current site should be unavailable. They are described as Sellar's Butte (Pleasant Hill), Sher Khan (Southeast Hills), Dodson Slough (Beltline and Delta), Camas Swale (Plot No. 351) and Pine Grove (Plot No. 254).
