Thanks for Riverfront Coverage

Thanks for Lucia McKelvey's fine article on the proposed Riverfront Research Park.

The struggle to stop the project is far from over. Anyone who is concerned about such issues as classified research, environmental pollution, and lack of public input in the project can take the following actions:

1. Vote against the Eugene city income tax November 5. A large part of the money from this tax would go to unspecified "capital improvements." As I read it, this could very well mean the Riverfront Research Park, despite what the city council is saying right now.

2. Citizen Action for Lasting Security is working to make Eugene a nuclear-free zone. This zone would include a ban on classified research. You can contact CALS at 343-8548, or write to them at 454 Willamette Street, Eugene, OR 97401.

3. The project's developer, David Carley, says community support is essential for the project's success. Write to him at: Carley Capital Group, 11777 San Vicente Blvd., Los Angeles, CA 90049.

4. Replace our current mayor and city council when they come up for reelection. This will prevent fiascos like the Riverfront Research Park from happening in the future.
