Fashion Show & Auction features wearable art, hand-crafted goods

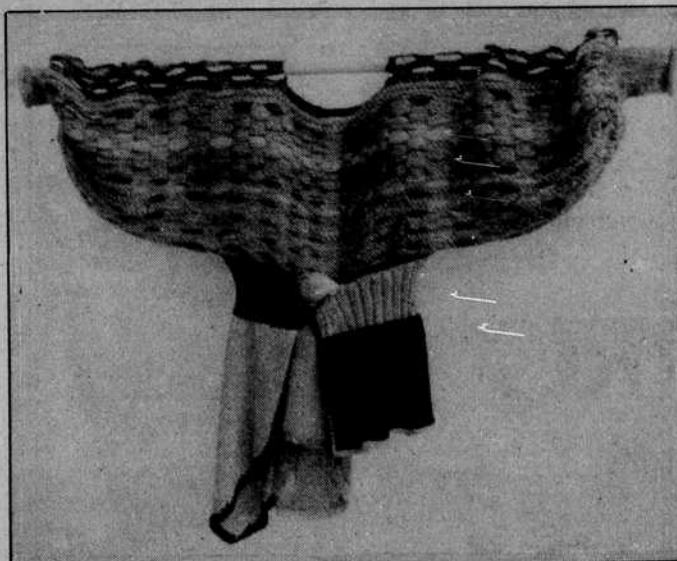
