Walk To Protect Waldo Wilderness

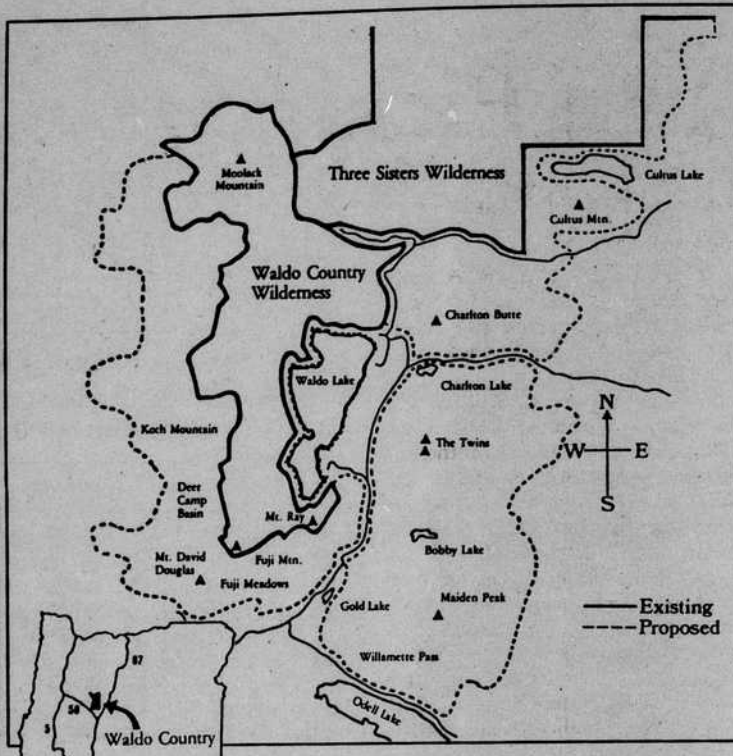
The Oregon Natural Resources Council (ONRC) is sponsoring the 4th Annual Walk Around Waldo Lake, Labor Day weekend (August 30 and 31). Saturday's activities begin with your choice of one of several day hikes in the Waldo Country (including a family hike) or a canoe trip on the Lake. ONRC will host a banquet, musical entertainment and campfire theater Saturday evening at Shadow Bay Campground. Campground reservations are available.

Sunday morning the 15-mile benefit Waldo Walk around Waldo Lake will take place. New this year is a Veterans' Waldo Walk through adjacent wilderness for participants of previous years. Participants collect pledges from friends, family, co-workers and neighbors for each mile they walk. Grand prizes of a Caribou Backpack and Walrus Backpacking Tent will be awarded to hikers collecting the most pledges. Waldo Wilderness t-shirts will be given to all Waldo Walk participants plus other incentives to collect pledges for Wilderness.

A supervised Tike Hike and Sunday afternoon activities will be offered for children (5+ years) whose parents participate in the Waldo Walk. Parents may join their children if they like.

Proceeds from the Waldo Walk will support ONRC's conservation and education efforts to provide protection of as yet undesignated Waldo Wilderness areas.

Waldo Country Wilderness

Some of the finest wild country left in the Cascades surrounds Waldo Lake, and extends over the crest, just south of the Three Sisters Wilderness Area. Within the region are approximately 95,000 acres of unprotected "de facto" wilderness forestlands, as well as ten peaks over 5000 feet in elevation, hundreds of miles of hiking trails, more than 60 named mountain lakes and dozens of miles of rivers and streams.

Unfortunately, political maneuvering during passage of the 1984 Oregon Forest Wilderness Act left several vital sections of the Waldo Country unprotected. The Waldo Wilderness Council has been leading the efforts of conservationists, sportsmen, outdoor recreation and scientific organizations to gain protection for these important areas. In addition to basic wilderness values of wildlife, watershed and recreation, each area within Waldo Country is valuable for many varied specific wilderness qualities.

The only way to truly appreciate this area is to go there, and experience it. Then ask yourself, "Will my children's children get to stand where I am now and experience the same beauty of unspoiled wilderness?" It's up to us to protect our Oregon heritage for the future. 100-Mile Bicycle Ride

Join hundreds of cyclists in Eugene's finest bicycle touring event. The Ninth Annual Willamette Flyway Century will be held Sunday, Sept. 14, starting at 7 am in Alton Baker Park. The route follows the Coast Range foothills from Eugene to Philomath and Corvallis, then turns south, continuing on flatland through Peoria, Harrisburg and Coburg to return to Alton Baker Park.
