North Bend's Public
Market uses 1914 art
for new venture

An abundance of talent can be found in the hills, valleys, sloughs and dunes of Oregon's Bay Area, Coos Bay/North Bend/Empire/Charleston. That talent will soon have a chance to be showcased at PUBLIC MARKET 'Saturdays-on-Sherman,' opening May 9 in downtown North Bend. "It's been a popular community practice with many of us to head for Eugene to take in the good food, fine crafts and art of Eugene's Saturday Market," says Keith Schroeder, spokesman for the new venture. "It dawned on us that a public market on the coast would be a welcome attraction not just for us but for the summer tourist trade."

As the tee-shirt and poster proclaims, PUBLIC MARKET Plans to be a "weekly gathering of crafts-persons, artisans, clowns, musicians, purveyors of fine foods, puppeteers, musketeers and racketeers." The last attraction may raise an eyebrow or two, but "that's just to show we're not taking ourselves overly serious," says Schroeder. However, organizers plan to structure the business carefully. "North Bend architect Randal Saunders has created a almost European atmosphere of 'the marketplace,'" says Schroeder. "Our plan is to create an attractive area for many public uses."

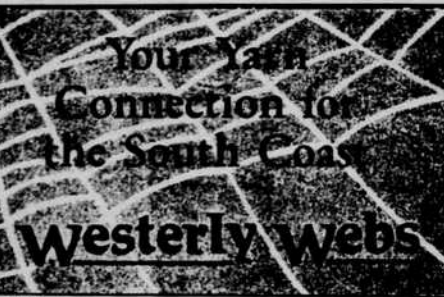
