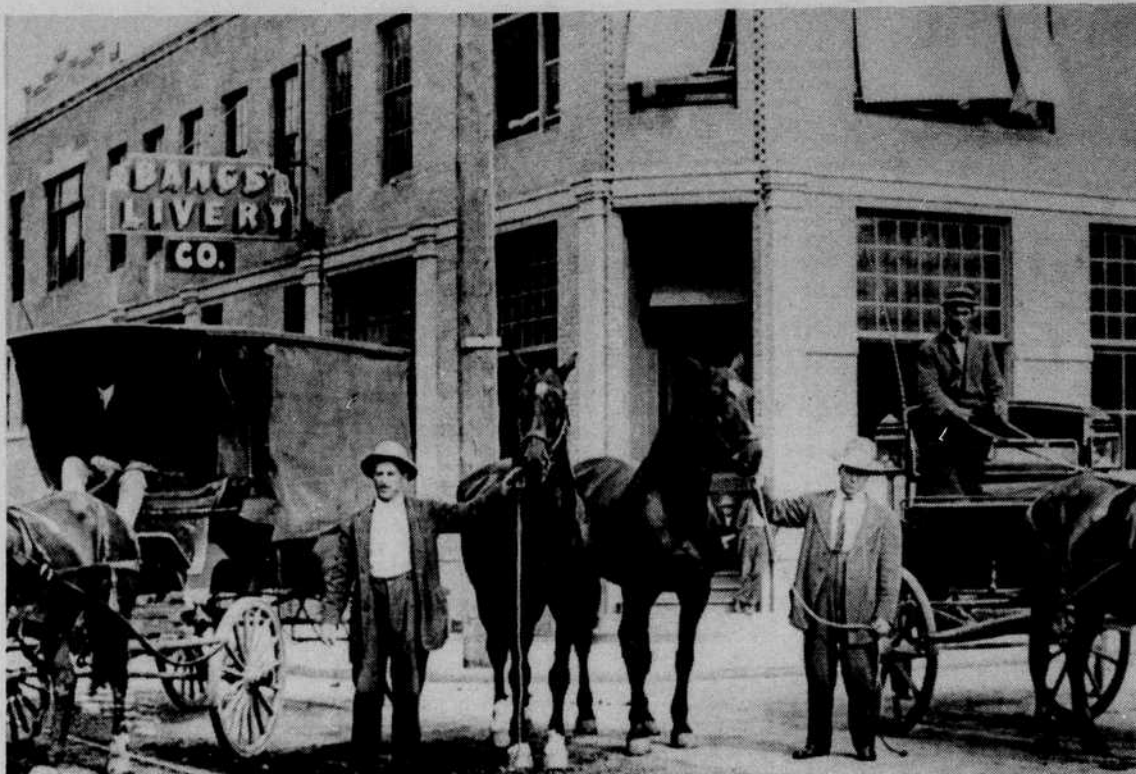

Horsing Around in Lane County

"Horsing Around in Lane County," an exhibit on the era of horse-drawn transportation, will be on display at the Lane County Historical Museum through June 20.

Besides the major focus on horse-drawn transportation, the exhibit explores the various occupations supported by horse power during the early years in Lane County. Freight, the Stage Company, the Fire Department, delivery service, and road construction are only a few topics covered in the exhibit.

The horse in our culture has had more impact on our ancestors' economic well-being than any other animal in history. Many aspects of the turn-of-the-century economy were directly related to this animal. Whole businesses, such as blacksmithing, livery stables, and harness mak-

ing depended on the horse as an indispensable part of everyday life.

The early years of the century brought an end to dependence on horse-drawn transportation. The automobile, in a relatively short period, changed our use of this animal from necessity to recreation and sport. The period covered by the exhibit is 1850 to 1914 and is supported by a wide variety of historical photographs and related artifacts from the museum's permanent collection.

Museum hours are 10 am-5 pm Tuesday-Friday, and 11 am-4 pm Saturday and Sunday. Admission is \$1/adults, 75¢/senior citizens, 50¢/18 and under. Friends of the Museum are admitted free. The museum is located at 740 West 13th, just east of the Fairgrounds.
