### Tones to premiere at O.E.S.

There's a new tone in town. White Tone fans, you're in for a treat. The White Tones have reincarnated. Lenny has moved on to Ashland, and in his place is a sparkling, new female vocalist.

Lest you worry that the Whitetones just wouldn't be the same without the crooner of "Why Do Fools Fall in Love?" you can relax. Lynda Duffy has joined the Eugene musical institution, and she is special.

Lynda's voice is no stranger to Eugene ears. A demo artist for Mason Williams, she has performed at the Hult Center with Don Latarski and sung jingles for the Coffee Corner. She has also done voice-overs for the Oakway Spa, the Emporium and Eugene Magazine.

The new group, now called "The Tones," has expanded musically. No longer strictly doo-wop, their new repertoire contains soul and Motown tunes such as "Tracks of My Tears" and "The Way You Do the Things You Do"; The Talking Heads' "Life During Wartime"; and a Beatles medley that includes "Please Please Me," "Twist and Shout" and "This Boy."

Co-founder Paul Friedlander says the group has been wanting to

broaden its repertoire and add a female voice for some time. With Lynda on board, they are able to "expand their vision of what the band was all about."

Lynda says that working in the a capella format with the group is one of the most creative experiences she has ever had. She says she felt an immediate musical rapport with members Paul Friedlander, Bill Chilla and Lea Jones and describes their vocal blending "like we'd been singing together for a long time."

I had the opportunity to sit in on an informal performance at the Quarterdeck. Not only is the vocal blend balanced, but there is a perkiness and zest about the newest member that is consistent with the tradition of the group.

The Tones premiere at the Electric Station Saturday, May 30 at 8:30 and 10:30 pm. Fans still get to hear their old favorites, which include "The Wanderer," "I Believe," "Why Do Fools Fall in Love?" and "Get a Job." It should be quite a bash.
