Benji, The Hunted: Rated G, and filmed in Oregon, this nostalgic Disney movie pairs canine Benji with wild animals. Springfield Quad (726-9073) and Movieland (342-4142).

Beverly Hills Cop II: As off-beat cop Axel Foley, Eddie Murphy laughs again. Brigitte Nielsen plays villainess. Springfield Quad (726-9073) and Movieland (342-4142).

Care Bears Part II: In double feature with *Flight of the Navigator*, at Movieland (342-4142).

Dragnet 1967: Dan Aykroyd portrays the nephew of "Just-the-Facts" Sergeant Friday, and Tom Hanks plays his side-kick, in a spoof of the TV series. Cinema World (342-6536).

Flight of the Navigator: A young boy commands a space ship, with some extraterrestrial help. Double feature with *Care Bears Part II* at Movieland (342-4142).

Harry and the Hendersons: Fantasy/comedy. John Lithgow and Don Ameche are in this movie about a family that falls in love with Bigfoot. McDonald (344-4343).

Platoon: Best picture and director of 1986, according to the Oscar-namers. A no-holds-barred view of life as a foot soldier during the Vietnam War, starring Charlie Sheen, Tom Berenger, and Willem Dafoe. Writer-director Oliver Stone was there. Predator: An unknown force pursues muscle man Arnold Schwarzenegger. Springfield Quad (726-9073).

River's Edge: A high school student is murdered, but the crime is hidden. Dennis Hopper and Crispin Glover are among those reacting to the events of this disturbing drama. Movieland (342-4142).

Roxanne: Steve Martin, with the longest nose since Pinocchio, and Daryl Hannah star in a modern-day comedy based on the story of Cyrano de Bergerac. Cinema World (342-6536).
