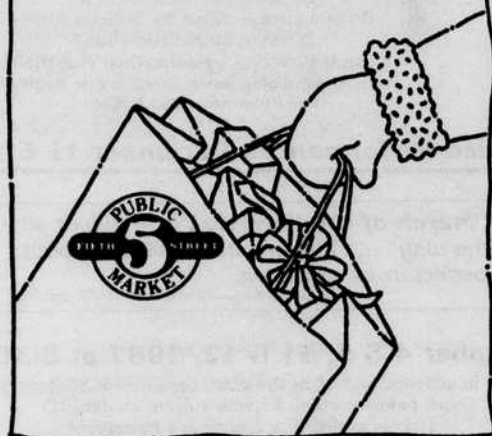
Slide Show/Speaker

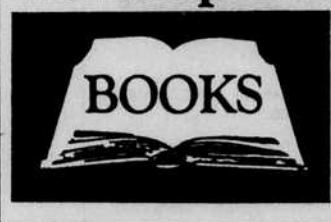
