At the opening of school an athletic rally was held in the school chapel. Several talks were delivered in the interest of the athletic teams for the school year. Mr. Smith was chosen general manager and treasurer and Mr. Larsen was selected as secretary of the Athletic Association.

Football is well under way and our boys are doing very well, considering the new material that is in the squad. Only three players of last year's squad are in the team, Capt.
