

On the afternoon of Sunday, Nov. 17, Bishop Scadding of Portland made a splendid address to those assembled in chapel. We were delighted to have him with us on that occasion.

Walter Haight has written a friend that he is now getting along nicely at Loleta, California. Of late he has been engaged at the business of fishing, making splendid wages. Both Walter and his wife are well and desire to be remembered to their friends.

On the Sunday evening that Colonel Hofer addressed the general assembly in chapel he was accompanied to Chemawa by Mr. and Mrs. Morrison-Reed, of Salem, each of whom sang a selection for us. Both of these vocalists possess unusual ability and we shall not soon forget their singing.

Since our last issue Chemawa was pleased to have a visit from Hon. John H. Stephens, congressman from Texas. The gentleman is chairman of the Committee of Indian Affairs of the House of Representatives. He chanced to be in this vicinity while on a tour of the Northwest and paid us an unofficial visit, coming here from Portland. He was surprised at the magnitude of our school.

Chapel services during general assembly on Sunday evenings have proved most interesting and instructive since the last issue. Those who have addressed us were: Mr. W. Nichols, a divinity student at the Willamette University; Colonel E. Hofer, formerly editor of the

Salem Capital Journal; Prof. E. Sherwood, of Willamette University; Rev. Barr G. Lee, of St. Paul's Episcopal Church, Salem, and W. O. Jungblut of Portland. All of the discourses of these gentlemen were most interesting and instructive.

The appropriation for the Chemawa school this year is \$120,000 against \$117,000 last year. The appropriation for last year included an estimate of \$6,000 for a new industrial building. Deducting the \$6,000 from the \$117,000 of last year's appropriation and we had left for maintenance, etc., \$111,000. Taking the estimated \$111,000 of last year from the \$120,000 of this year and we have a difference of \$9,000 in our favor. We do not know to a certainty just what is intended shall be done with the additional \$9,000, but are certain that our school will be benefitted to this extent and are very thankful for the same.
