OUR SCHOOL

Our school at present has an enrollment of 554 student, 350 having entered since September 1, 1912.

The various grades in the Academic Department were so crowded that an additional teacher was added to our force lately by the Indian Office. While most of our students are from the Northwest, we have many from California, Nevada, Arizona, New Mexico and Utah. These number in all 391, representing 60 different Indian tribes. In addition we have 163 native Alaskan children, representing 24 different tribes; in the whole school there being 554 children, representing 84 different tribes.

Superintendent Wadsworth has no trouble in filling the school, if the funds for transportating the children from their homes to the school only hold out. Owing to the very large number of new students being brought to the school within so short a time, the disbursements on account of their transportation are unprecedented. A great number have come to the school at their own expense, and seemed delighted to take advantage of the opportunity of being identified with the "New Chemawa."
