IN the school office sets the many trophies won by the different athletic teams. A few years ago our teams competed with the largest colleges in the west, and on account of being superior in baseball we have a number of trophies. These trophies bring to my mind the hard work and loyalty of our athletic manager, D. E. Brewer, to whom honor is do.

The team won two trophies in the year of 1899, winning one from the Willamette Valley Chautauqua Association and the other from the Regatta Association at Astoria, Oregon. Two in 1900; one at the Willamette Valley Chautauqua Association; the other from Multnomah Club, at Portland. The last two of the baseball trophies won was one at Brooks and the other at Dallas.

Our boys also won a four-mile relay on July 4, 1908, for which they received a trophy. One of our boys, Amos Smoker, won his match at the Cherry City Wrestling Tournament, and presented the school the trophy as a remembrance.

A cup was won by Company "A" under the command of Captain Andy Walker in 1913. Another trophy was won in the same year by Company "C" under the command of Captain Alvina Smith. These trophies are good examples set by our former teams for our future teams to follow. As our greatest athlete, Mr. R. Sanders, said at the football reception, "There they are, go get some more." Let us adopt this saying as our motto.
