AGRICULTURE FOR GRADES

A MODEL COUNTRY SCHOOL



THE fitting of the country boy and girl for a successful career on the farm should receive greater attention. Our country schools are not fully equipped for the task. The country school is for an agricultural class of people and therefore should be designed and equipped to so develop the country people that they be the best of farmers when they reach maturity.

It has been well said that we must not only educate the boy and girl, but all the people. Training should not stop simply because people are no longer attending the public school. A training that assists the people of the home in getting the most out of life for the support of life should be the aim of education. A means to this end for the farmer would be a model school farm.

One of the greatest drawbacks in a country school is the lack of a competent teacher. The country schools should be taught by men and women who are in sympathy with country life and farm operations. The man teacher should be a person that knows the art of scientific agriculture. The woman teacher should be a person who knows the art of domestic science. Two teachers of this type should be employed permanently in a two-roomed country school.

The school farm would help out the salary question. The man teacher could have what he could raise on the farm besides the money salary. This would offer an inducement that would secure the services of a competent man for the head of the school.
