Not an infraction of the rules occurs once a month. I saw them take supper, and a more orderly assemblage I never saw—nor a happier. Everything moved like clockwork, without noise; friction or confusion. This is the only school of the kind where the sexes sit at the same tables, but an agent from Washington told me he expected the method, which is Mr. Wadsworth's, would be followed by all the large schools as soon as orders can be issued.

OUR DAIRY DEPARTMENT

CHEMAWA is fortunate in having one of the best dairy departments in the Indian service. Dairying is taught in theory and practice; every phrase of dairying is gone into, from judging the stock when it is bought, to testing the milk in the creamery with a Babcock tester.

Insilage is the chief diet for the cows in the winter, supplemented with nice shiney hay and grain, all of which is raised by the dairy boys. In the Fall, roots and kale aid materially toward feeding the milk producers.

The milk is taken care of in a novel one-story structure, which is literally the home of the dairy boys. The building is divided into several rooms; all theoretical instruction is given in the class-room; the walls of this room are covered with charts and diagrams. There is a locker room; every boy has a locker to keep his white suit and clothes in. There is a sanitary lavatory fitted up with a unique shower bath. The study-room is a cozy little dairyman's library. All of the latest periodicals are examined by the boys during their leisure time. The whole building is heated by a heating plant independent of the rest of the school. The boiler-room contains a fifty-horse power, high pressure, boiler which heats water and furnishes steam for cleansing cans and buckets. It does not require an engineer to run the boiler. The dairy boys all understand what every dairyman should know about his own plant.

The whole building is enamel white inside and out, except the concrete floors and wainscoting, the latter which is of a chocolate hue. It
