HANDSOME LAKE'S CODE

FOUNDER OF THE SO-CALLED NEW RELIGION



RECENTLY the State Museum of New York issued a bulletin entitled "The Code of Handsome Lake, the Seneca Prophet" (Bulletin 163.) Handsome Lake was the founder of the so-called "new religion" of the Six Nations, and his teachings were begun at the very opening of the last century. This is still the native religion of the aborigines, qualified in a measure, however, by their contact with Christianity, but it is a code of ethics that would make any man who followed it implicitly, a good man, and any community that followed its precepts, in harmony with the best conceptions of civic duty. The teachings of the prophet which have been transmitted from mouth to mouth by authorized "holders," are still the moral code of the pagan Indians on the reservations, of whom there is a large number.
