JUNIOR RED CROSS

The literary societies have taken up the work of establishing the Junior Red Cross at Chemawa. The object being to make every student a member. A fund for such purpose was started by the Excelsiors who donated \$5 to make twenty of the younger students members.

This was followed by the Winonas in giving a bazaar from which \$30 was placed in the fund for the purpose of making 120 students members, with the offer also to give \$30 additional if necessary. The Nonpareils instead of their annual social, are planning for a Junior Red Cross drive with the expectation of practically all of the balance of students securing a membership.

This drive will consist of selling tickets for an evening of pleasure on Saturday night next, to be held in the gym. All money spent will either make the individual a member or assist in giving membership to others.

MADE GOOD SHOWING

Elwood Towner and Irving Shepard crowned themselves with all kinds of glory when they walked off with the honors as high point winners at the Salem High School inter-class field meet on the Willamette track last Friday afternoon. Elwood made first place with 17 points, while Irving registered as his nearest competitor with 12 points.

These two young fellows need to be commended on the good showing they are making in Salem. Like the rest of our young people attending the high school, they are leading in many of their classes, but the track is a new feature with them, and they need to be complimented on such an excellent showing.

Elwood came first in the 100-yard dash, first in the 220-yard dash, second in the quarter-mile run, third in the pole vault and second in the 120-yard hurdles. Irving came first in the 120-yard hurdles, second in the 100-yard dash, second in the broad jump, and third in the high jump.

Elwood is a senior and will finish in February, while Irving is a member of the class of 1920.
