In the distance could be seen the good Red Cross ship "Chemawa," loaded down with the members of this musical organization, who wore the uniforms of Red Cross nurses. Nearer and nearer the good ship approached until finally it was docked and the nurses with their instruments disembarked. As the ship came in the girls were playing, but immediately after the landing they found themselves in the midst of our wounded "over there"—somewhere in France—and they took up the roll of entertainers as well as angels of mercy.

Here began the concert proper and in every way it was most pleasing. Agnes Swanson was the vocal soloist, as well as a member of club. On the refrain of her number she was joined by Julia Gromoff and they earned the enthusiastic recall which greeted their efforts. At the close of the concert they embarked on the "Chemawa" for home and there was music in the air as they and their staunch ship faded from sight.
