To replace Julian Smith, quarterback, is our most difficult task. "Buck" proved to be an able field general last fall. He guided his team through the storms of the season in a creditable manner. Dowd Franklin is being groomed for the position. Dowd can kick, pass and block but the boy who takes it upon himself to fill that position almost has to be a master of all three.
