Friday night, Oct 14, the Chemawa Chiefs played a 6-6 tie with the Independence Hoppers in the Hop Bowl at Independence. Independence an undefeated, untied team since the '37 season, was favored to beat the Braves who never seemed to hit their stride. On the muddy field it was anybody's game. Both teams were evenly matched with every one playing heads-up ball. Chemawa elected to receive and after the first few plays fumbled and Independence recovered on the Chemawa 30. After two line plunges Independence netted five yards. A pass to Hartman made the first touchdown; the try for point failed. Chemawa again elected to receive. The Braves then marched 60 yards for a touchdown, with Danzuka running 30 yards to pay dirt. Danzuka again hit the line but missed hitting the jack-pot by inches. In the main event Cobell won a decision over Dillingham, 175.
