"Bunny" Bennett, Ex-Willamette Gridiron Star, Coaching Braves

"Bunny" Bennett, star halfback for Willamette Bearcats for the past three years is taking over the coaching duties left vacant when Jerry Gastineau, former coach, left to coach for Ashland Hi in Southern Oregon.

In summing up his football outlook for the season Coach Bennett reports he has four lettermen on hand: halfbacks, Joseph and Danzuka; tackles, Berger and Bearchum. In addition to these four lettermen, the boys who show promise of landing a berth on the varsity are: Tony Van Pelt, left end; George Rice, left guard; Bill Maxwell, center; Preston Davis, right guard; Frank Charles, right tackle; Max Jackson, right end; Henry Corville, quarterback; Clarence LaRoque, right halfback; Ted Hoover, a transfer from Toledo high school, and a fine bunch of freshmen and sophomores to play on the "Bee" team.

After many days of drilling, and hard grueling scrimmages and learning the fundamentals of football, Coach Bennett selected these braves as his starting line-up: L.E., Van Pelt; L.G., Rice; L.T., Bearchum; C., Maxwell; R.G., Davis; R.T., Charles or Berger; R.E., Jackson; Q.B., Joseph; L.H., Danzuka; R.H., LaRoque; and F.B., Hoover.

Braves tie Forest Grove

Chemawa opened her season by playing a deadlock with the Forest Grove Vikings. Chemawa pushed her touchdown over in the first quarter, and the Vikings in the latter part of the second period. The Indians threatened again in the closing minutes of the ball game, but due to the fact that they were not in tiptop condition they missed the chance of making another touchdown. The game was played on the Pacific Unirversity gridiron.

WVI Football Jamboree

touchdown, but a substitute was on the field waiting to report to the officials, and the play had to be called back. The jamboree was held on Sweetland field on the Willamette University campus.

Buckaroos Whip Indians

Molalla's Buckaroos got off in front of the Willamette Valley Interscholastic League race for 1940 here a week ago last Friday afternoon with a 12 to 7 victory scored over the Chemawa Chiefs by dint of two touchdown saunters by halfback Hampton.

Hoover counted for the Indians, on a one-yard smash through the line, after Rice intercepted a pass on Chemawa 10 and ran it 85 yards to the Molalla five yard line. A bad pass from Center Maxwell over Hoover's head in the third period as the fullback stood on his own 35 yd. line in punt formation, set the stage for the second Buckaroo touchdown. The game was played on Saunders field, and it was a pretty good game until Molalla got a good break and they made use of it registering their victory in the W.V.I. league race.

Foxes Blank Redskins

By a margin of two touchdowns, both of which were in the nature of "breaks," the Silverton Foxes blanked the Chemawa Indians last Friday night, in Silverton's first home game on Mcginnis field.
