Chemawa Indians Defeat Woodburn Eleven Twice

In a hard-hitting, wild scoring football game here on Friday, November 15, Chemawa Indians won their second game of the season when they bested the Woodburn Bulldogs 19-14. After a scoreless first period, the Chiefs churned into pay dirt with Halfback LaRocque going the final five yards of a 55-yard drive on a double reverse. Fullback Joseph's dropkick was no good on the attempted conversion. The Chiefs scored twice in the third period, and Berger, the hard hitting quarterback, hit the left side of line to add the conversion. Woodburn scored their touchdown in the third period, a safety and another touchdown in the final period to make the final score 19-14, in favor of the Indians.

Playing a return game to the Woodburn Bulldogs on Thanksgiving morning, the Chemawa Indians ran wild to score a 26-0 victory over the Bulldogs in the season final game for both teams. Halfback LaRocque scored one touchdown from the five yard line in the second period, and another one in the third quarter after Danzuka and Berger ran the ball to the ten yard line. In the final quarter the Chiefs scored two more when sub quarterback Rice sneak over from the four yard line, and LaRocque pitched a pass to Finley for the fourth touchdown. Maxwell, the third string guard saved the Indians from getting scored upon in the final minute of play when he caught Halfback Peltz out in the open on the Braves 15-yard line.

Chemawa Hoop Squad turns Out

Twenty-seven eager, but inexperienced hoopers answered Coach "Bunny" Bennett's call for basketball turn out on Monday, November 18.

Gone from last year's District 11 champions who placed fifth in the State basketball tournament are seven regulars: Woundedeye, Backbone, Shoulderblade, Scalpcane, Van Pelt, Two Crows, and Bird. Only letterman back is Louis Goodluck, and Leslie Brendible who was a reserve on last year's squad. More than a dozen more are expected to turn out after the football season is over after Thanksgiving.

Chemawa will play in the newly formed "Big Nine" league, along with the members of the WVI league, which was broken up when some of the schools resigned from the league. It is expected that the team will make another tour of

Southern Oregon, and the Indian's schedule will also include some of the "A" schools of the Willamette Valley.

Indians Bow to Cheesemakers

Playing on a slippery and muddy field the Tillamook Cheesemakers fashioned a 13 to 7 victory over the Chemawa Indians on Friday afternoon, November 8. Although they failed to turn in a first down the Cheesemakers netted their touchdowns in two plays. Smith, from punt formation, collected the first six points after racing 70 yards; Wells, on a reverse chalked up the other one in the second period.

The Indians scored in the second half following a sustained drive of 65 yards, with fullback Joseph hitting his own right tackle to score the Indians only touchdown. The Indians were on the Cheesemakers 20 yard line as the whistle blew to indicate that it was end of the ball game.

All-Stars Whip Super-Varsity

Due to the fact that the Varsity had a league game to play with Woodburn, the All-Stars did not have much opposition when they walloped the Super-Varsity 20-0 on Armstice day. on the opening kick-off, the All-Stars marched 80 yards for the first touchdown, with Queampts hitting the center of the line, and Brewer adding the conversion on a reverse going around the left end. The Super-Varsity penetrated into the All-Star 20-yard line in the second period, only to lose the ball on downs. In the third period the All-Stars were knocking at the door as a result of a fumble by the Super-Varsity. Then they were held for downs and the Super-Varsity punted to their own 40-yard line. On a double reverse, left halfback Shilo whipped around his own right end to the 20-yard line. Then Queampts passed to left end Mesplie for the second touchdown. In the final quarter, the All-Stars scored again when Shilo again went around right end for 15 yards, and Lodge made the conversion. The All-Stars threatened in the closing moments of the game when Van Pelt passed to Lodge and he broke lose for another touchdown. The play had to be called back due to one of the All-Stars holding. The game was full of thrills and both teams showed some excellent blocking and tackling. The All-Stars were a little too good for the Super-Varsity.
