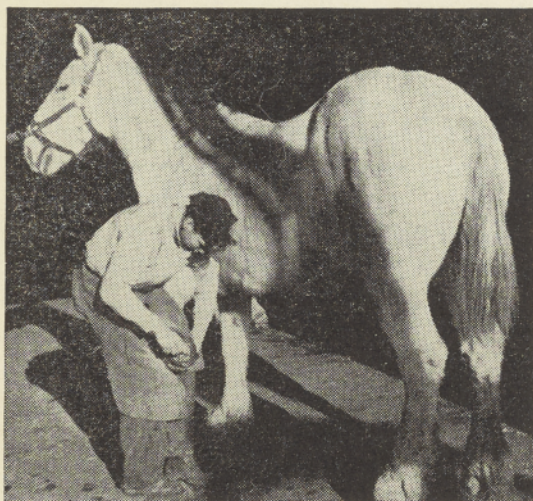
horses age, drive teams, wash and grease a wagon, keep the harness room in order, and "bit break" a horse.
