## Christmas Feast of Northern Cheyenne Tribe

The Northern Cheyenne Tribe of Tongue River reservation gather at their community halls on Christmas day to enjoy their Christmas feast from their annual money donations through their various recreations.

There are four districts on the reservation and all districts have the same program. They elect the officers to supervise the tribe's celebration. The officers are entitled to give away the presents which include horses with pretty shawls, blankets, etc. covering them. During the time of donations some people give away cattle. On Christmas the tribe donations of money in each district amount to over

\$100.00 and include several heads of cattle. The money is used for food and some of it goes to candies, etc, for the children and they also often reserve some for the New Year's Eve celebration.

The entire tribe is very happy at this time of the year and rejoice. They dance till day break on Christmas and on New Years.—WILBUR WOLFNAME
