Chemawa Places Second in District Wrestling Tournament

Sanford Beaudry, 145 lbs. and Cecil Offield, 112 lbs. of Chemawa, emerged victorious in their respective divisions Saturday in the district wrestling meet held in the Salem High gymnasium.

Chemawa and Silverton placed second with two wins each. The winners from this tournament entered the state tournament held at Corvallis, Saturday February 28.

Salem High was the winner of the meet placing six entries in the forthcoming state meet.
