Dr. R. M. Tisinger, area education director of Indian Affairs, Portland, was honored at a reception sponsored by Local No. 241, N.F.F.E. Chemawa Indian school, with all employees of the school as hosts, Thursday evening, February 28.

Dr. Tisinger recently returned after a year in Burma, where he was sent by UNESCO (United National Educational Scientific Cultural Organization) as head of an educational mission to study the educational situation and recommend changes.

The group of which Dr. Tisinger was a member visited 250 schools. He reports, "The Burmese Education Program is far from adequate and perhaps the greatest need is for more and better qualified teachers."
