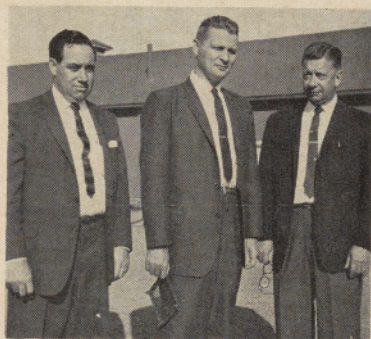
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The hurricane lasted for more than two hours. I was at the gymnasium when the storm started. There were several boys and girls there. It was beginning to get windy.
