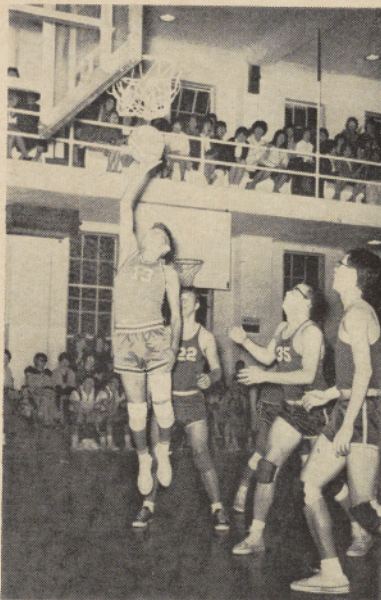
This is a very valuable mass production project. Several have already been placed about the campus which adds much to its park-like appearance.
