In the fireproof vault is "Chemawa's Big Book", the Register of Students, which contains the names of thousands of students who have received all or most of their educational training at Chemawa. The first student enrolled was Charles Ashue, Puyallup Tribe, Puyallup, Washington, who entered February 25, 1880. The last student enrolled, number 16,150 is Frederick George Bremner, age 16, Thlinget Tribe of Yakutat, Alaska, who entered February 15, 1964.
