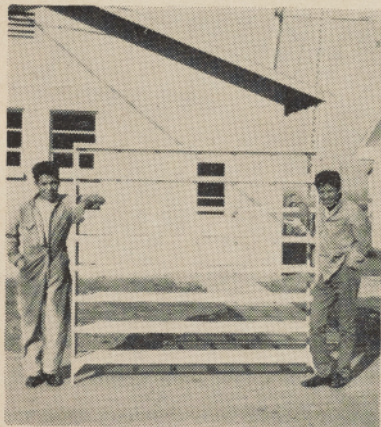




PICKING THE FRUIT: Ella Sun on the ladder. Lorraine Pratt holding the pan.

SCHOOL LIBRARY NOTES

The Chemawa School Library is beginning its second year as a separate service of the school. Much has been accomplished and the reference department now meets the requirements for school libraries. The book collection is being increased as rapidly as books can be processed. A card catalog has been added this Fall and about 50% of the books are now cataloged.

We are receiving Portland and Salem daily newspapers, also the Tundra Times and the Navajo Times. We also receive about 40 magazines, most of which are listed in the Readers' Guide to Periodical Literature. Other magazines have been given by the staff and are placed in the permanent file if they are listed in the Readers' Guide. We are especially pleased with the gift of the National Geographic Magazine from 1938 to the present. These are very useful in the classes.

Rena Davis, grade 10, is working in the library morning and receiving vocational training. She is now able to take over the desk work completely and to process the new books and is learning the procedures of book mending. Other library assistants are Lucille Killbear, Sharon Velarde, and James Jackson.

The students are acquiring the "library habit" and are making it a part of their school life. Circulation is increasing every week.
