Girls from the university picked the girls up after church and returned them to campus late in the afternoon.

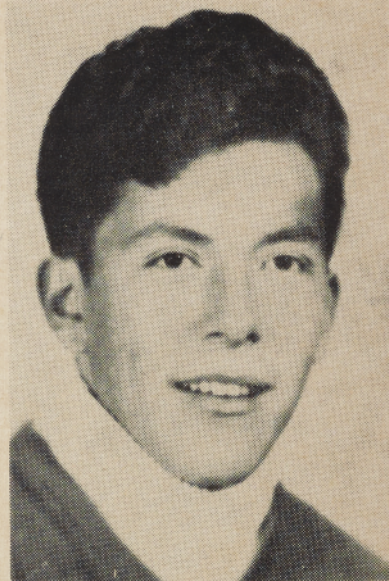
