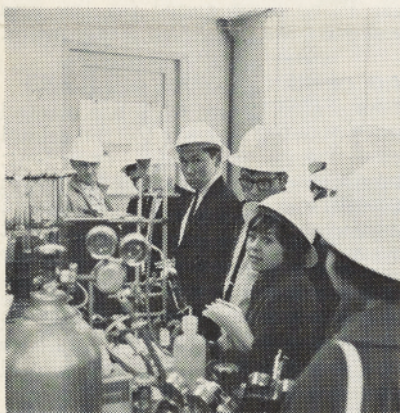


BRAVES PREPARE FOR CAGE EVENTS

The three consumer chemistry classes were recent visitors at the Pennsalt Chemical Plant, Portland, Oregon.

As soon as we arrived off the bus we went into the main office and signed the guest register. After groups with eight people in a group. Our guide gave each of us a hard hat to wear on our tour.

We started with the huge piles of salt. Our guide told us that the salt used at the plant is sea salt and that it comes from Lower California. It is brought to Portland four times a year by ship.

Pennsalt recovers all kinds of different chemicals which are present in the sea salt such as: hydroxides of sodium and potassium, and ammonia.

It took over three hours to tour the entire plant but everyone who made the trip thought it was worth it.
