The program for the summer is a combined study and work program. The purpose of the program is to present science information in a manner that is far different than what is used during the regular school year.

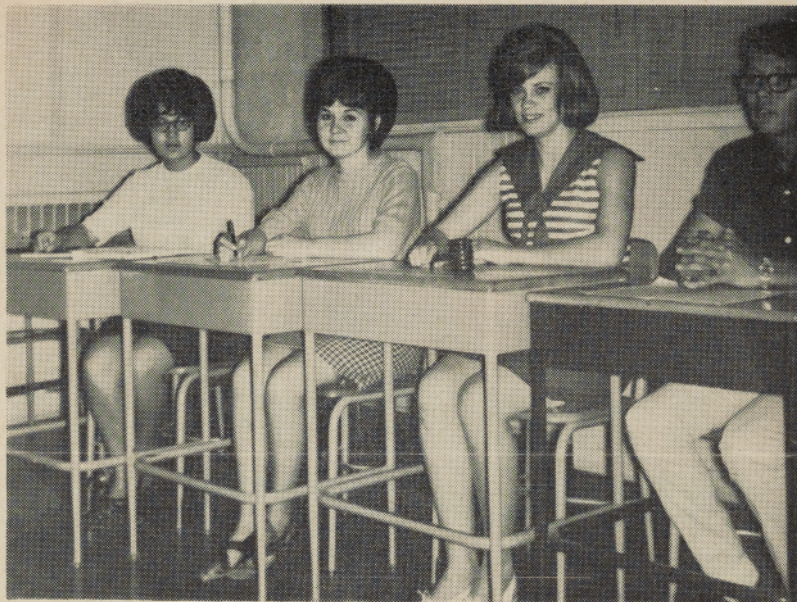

There will be two sections of students. When one section is studying the other section will be performing the work tasks around the campus. At the end of the week the two sections will exchange places.

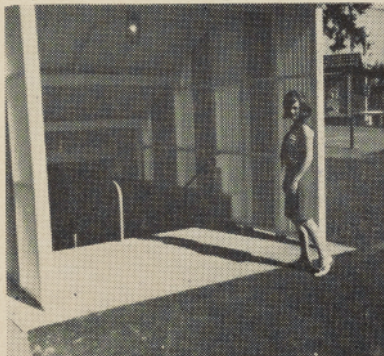
