It was a colorful performance and enjoyed by all.

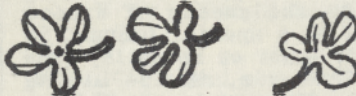

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BEGINNING MECHANICS A POPULAR CLASS

A new vocational class being offered this year has proven very popular with students. About 70 boys have enrolled in a beginning mechanics course which is being taught by Mr. Ray McNabb.

In this class students learn the working principles and the parts of the internal combustion engine as it is used in power equipment and vehicles.

Already this year they have taken apart and put back together small engines such as the ones that are used on lawn mowers and skidoos. They have also learned to completely overhaul outboard motors.

Before the year is over the boys will have completely disassembled and put back together an automobile engine. It isn't so much the tearing down and putting back together that is so tough. The catch is that you have to make it perform perfectly after you are through.

The students also study the auxillary systems that go along with an engine, like fuel supply, ignition, cooling and electrical.
