

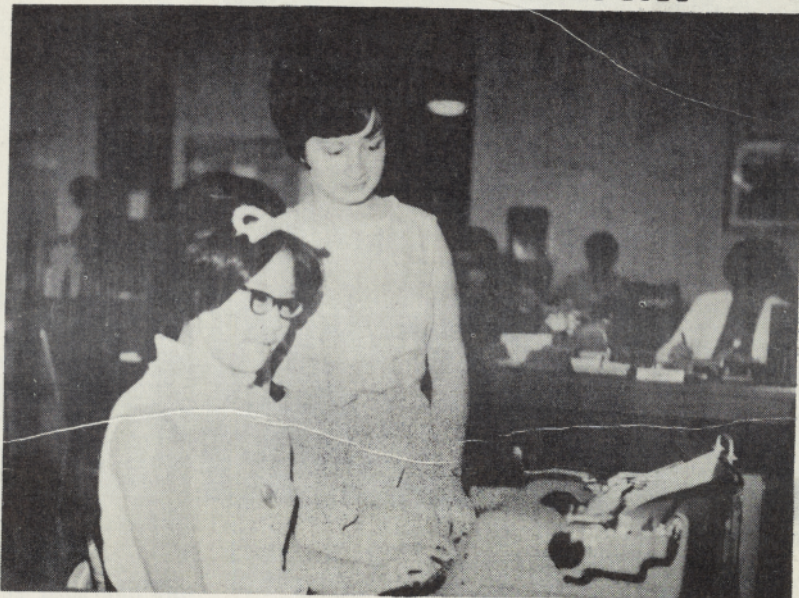
CHEMAWA'S OCCUPATIONAL SKILLS CAREER EDUCATION PROGRAM

Six Chemawa Seniors were selected to participate in an on-the-job training program, where they can apply skills and knowledge acquired in the classroom.

Through the Business Education and Industrial Education Departments, these students are able to further their training at the Social Security Administration, the Bureau of Land Management and the Bureau of Reclamation.

This program provides training unavailable in the normal pre-vocational classroom. It is intended to give the students specific and related experiences to enrich their educational environment. It also gives the students depth and insight into the knowledge of occupational fields.
