210 Seniors Live Off Campus In Salem Apartments

To date, two-hundred and ten senior boys and girls have had an opportunity to participate in Chemawa's Off-Campus Living program. Ninety boys and one hundred twenty girls have had to do their own cooking, ironing, cleaning, shopping and arranging for their transportation to and from school. The students live off campus for a period of two weeks. They live by the buddy system - taking care of each other - and are placed on the honor system.

The program was initiated and is supervised by Chemawa's Guidance Department and is very popular with the students. The program is considered by all to be a big success. The girls are encouraged to entertain members of the faculty as guests once or twice during their apartment living experience.

It is felt that the students will get an idea of what it is like to live in an apartment; handle their own finances; how to report for school on time; how to manage their off-duty time; and, how to budget for food buying in large supermarkets.
