

NEW CLASSES

Chemawa's curriculum has been expanded this year with the addition of four new classes. These elective subjects are Pre-Algebra, Psychology, Graphic Arts, and Physics. Each course has been initiated to provide a wider educational background for the students of Chemawa.

What do these new courses offer?

Psychology is a new class offered to Sophomores, Juniors and Seniors. It is the scientific study of animals, which includes man.

Some of the areas to be covered are the following: Principles of Learning, Understanding Personality, How Behavior Develops, Heredity and Environment, Emotional Problems, Problems of Family Group and Social Problems.
