

Cross Country Team Excels

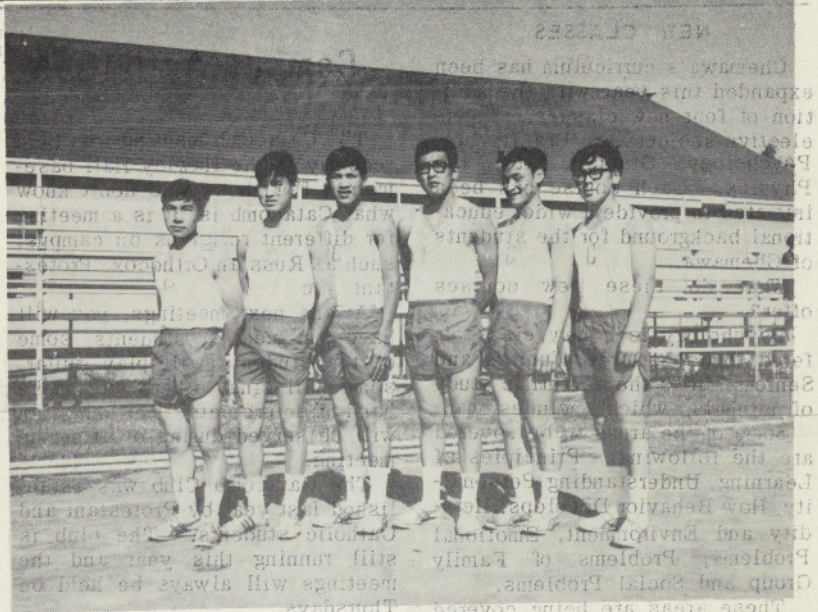
The 1969 Chemawa Cross-Country program is, again in full swing, with five lettermen heading the list of fourteen runners on the Varsity and Junior Varsity teams. Coached by Kugie Louis, now in his third year as head coach, Chemawa will be out to defend its Capital Conference District Championship won last year in its first year in the league. The Braves went on to place second in the State Meet last November.

Leading runner for the Braves this year and individual District champ a year ago is Leonard Huntington, a 2-year Junior letterman from Galena, Alaska. Huntington has already established himself as the greatest distance runner in the history of Chemawa and will be trying for state honors after a seventh-place finish last year at the State Meet, where over 200 runners competed.

Dimitri Johnson appears to offer the stiffest challenge to dethrone Huntington as League champ, having placed second to his teammate last year at District. Johnson, a Junior, is a 2-year letterman from Koliganek, Alaska. Edwig Pete, a Junior, is the third member of the 'Three Musketeers'. Pete is also in his third year, having lettered both as a Freshman and a Sophomore. Pete has been pushing both Huntington and Johnson in early training. Pete is from Stebbins, Alaska. Arnold Mark won a letter last as a Sophomore in his first year out for Cross-Country. Mark is a Junior from Huslia, Alaska.

The other letterman is John Brower, the lone Senior member of the squad, from Barrow, Alaska. Nick Phillip from Kongiganok and Don Stevens from Stevens Village, round out the seven-man varsity team.

The Junior Varsity, made up entirely of Freshmen, include: Tom Brown, Arthur Ambrose, Joe Peters, Harold Huntington, Roy Williams, Robert Ezekiel and Mike George. Willie Lake owns the distinction of serving as the official team manager.

The Junior Varsity team, nearly all Freshmen, won their races with Tom Brown pulling off an upset, winning the 2.5 mile race in 13:41. Arthur Ambrose took third. Harold Huntington (11) and Roy Williams (15), also received ribbons. Willie Lake finished 23rd to help his team.

Chemawa has now won five cross-country trophies, so far this year.

Chemawa's Varsity Football team has played five games this year.

Chemawa lost to Siletz on September 12, with a score of Siletz 25 and Chemawa 8.

Chemawa lost to the Woodburn Bulldogs on September 19. The final score was Woodburn 56 and Chemawa 14. Woodburn is rated ninth in the state.

On September 26, the Braves lost to Cascade with the score Cascade 38 and Chemawa 20. This game was a passing game. A Chemawa touchdown pass was called back because of a penalty.

Chemawa lost to Stayton on October 2, with the final score Stayton 40 and Chemawa 0.
