

COMPUT-MOBILE VISITS

The computer classes of Chemawa, taught by Mrs. Mary Kay Randall, have an IBM 1130 computer available for their use during the second semester.

The Computer Instruction Network (CIN), a federally funded project and a part of Marion County Intermediate Education District (IED), provides the computer for the classes free of charge. Glen Stonebrink, a CIN employee, brings the van to Chemawa three times each week. Students then run the programs they have prepared while in class. The programs are written in Fortran, a type of computer language. Corrections to the programs are made in the comput-mobile or in the classroom and then run again.

The computer students seem to feel the IBM 1130 is a very good way of learning programming. Below are some comments made by the class members.
